WHAT IS THE ZOBIN METHOD?

WHAT IS PROJECT KRIAH ABOUT?

The primary mission of Project Kriah, a project of Learning Directions, is to place at least one qualified mechanech, who is proficient in The Zobin Method, in every Yeshiva in North America, in order to help talmidim overcome Kriah difficulties.

As an integral part of Project Kriah, Learning Directions has asked Rabbi Tzvi Zobin to come to the United States to give a limited number of workshops on his unique method.



HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN PROJECT KRIAH?

By attending the initial workshops you will have the opportunity to learn The Zobin Method from Rabbi Zobin himself. Subsequent workshops will be given by instructors trained and certified by Rabbi Zobin. We encourage Yeshivos to send one or two mechanchim to attend the workshops.

WHAT TOOLS WILL THE WORKSHOPS GIVE ME AS A MECHANECH/TEACHER?

The workshops will guide you through The Zobin Method, providing you with the necessary concepts and practical applications, enabling you to Assess, Review/Identify, and Remediate, as outlined to the left, when teaching talmidim how to read Lashon Hakodesh.

All materials needed for the workshops, such as worksheets, post-evaluation reports, and small electronics (flashlights, etc.), will be provided.

WHEN AND WHERE ARE YOU OFFERING THE WORKSHOPS ON THE ZOBIN METHOD?

We will be scheduling workshops at a number of locations, including Brooklyn, Lakewood and Queens.

Please be aware that each workshop series is limited to twelve mechanchim.

WHAT IS THE COURSE STRUCTURE?

For most locations, there will be a total of four sessions per course, running within a day or two of each other.

This breakdown will provide the mechanech time to absorb the material, yet still retain it as fresh so he can “field-test” each step as it is learned.

At the end of the final session, Project Kriah will certify the mechanchim who have successfully completed the course.
